WHAT GOD HATH JOINED TOGETHER

Matthew 19:3-9

I. INTRODUCTION:

- 1. Strawberries & shortcake; turkey & dressing; Chicago Cubs and futility; these are just a few things that are joined together and always will be.
- 2. 2 But, more importantly, there's a statement in the Bible that says "what...God hath joined together." It comes from Jesus' teaching on marriage in Matthew 19:6.
- 3. We usually only think of a "husband and wife" when we read "what therefore God has joined together, let not man put asunder"; however, there are other things that "God hath joined together" that we as men have no business putting asunder.
- 4. So for the brief few minutes we have together this evening let's examine "what God hath joined together."

II. DISCUSSION:

- 1. 3 Husband and Wife: Matt. 19:3-9 4, 5, 6
 - A. 7 God's plan from the beginning was one man for one woman for life (Gen. 2:18, 24)(Adam & Eve; not Adam & Steve, or Eve & Eva).
 - B. Sex is reserved for the marriage relationship (Lev. 18:6, 22-23; 20:13-16; Rom. 1:26-27; Heb. 13:4).
 - C. Only death and infidelity can sever the marriage bond (Rom. 7:1-4; Matt. 19:9). Anyone putting asunder their marriage is going against God's will!

2. 8 Christ and the church:

- A. 9 Many say we need to "preach Christ, but not preach the church" (i.e., biblical truth of one church is considered to be too arrogant, too intolerant, totally politically incorrect); Eph. 1:22-23
- B. Furthermore, Christ is the head of the church and savior of the body (Eph. 5:22-23; Col. 1:18). If this is so how could one ever put Christ and the church "asunder"?
- C. When Saul persecuted the "church" (Acts 8:1) he was persecuting Christ! Acts 9:4 The church and Christ are inseparable! Anyone who seeks to put them asunder is putting asunder something God has joined together!

3. 10 Worship in Spirit and Truth: 11 |n. 4:24

- A. In regards to worship anything goes in this day and age! (e.g., "Beer and Hymn Singing")
- B. II Any worship man invents, however "good intentioned" is "vain" (Matt. 15:9); it is "will" worship (Col. 2:20-23); and is totally unacceptable to God (Lev. 10:1-2; 16:12).
- C. Even those who follow the NT pattern can be guilty of "vain" worship (Mal. 1:6-13).
- D. God has joined "the spirit and the truth" in worship and we dare not put them asunder.

4. 12 Faith and Works: 13 James 2:14-26

- A. It is absolutely true that we cannot earn our salvation, but there are things (i.e., works) that we must do! Eph. 2:8-10; Gal. 5:6 ("works of faith"; Rom. 10:17).
- B. Acts 10:35 and Rom. 2:6 (Psa. 62:12) makes it crystal clear that there are "works of righteousness" that make us acceptable to God. What "works"? The "good works, which God prepared beforehand that we should walk in them." (Eph. 2:10)
- C. So God has joined "faith and works" and we dare not put them asunder!

5. 14 Sin and Death: 15 Rom. 3:23

- A. What is sin? I Jn. 3:4
- B. What is sin's result? Ezek. 18:4 (Isa. 59:2)

- C. This result of sin is referred to as a "law" (Rom. 8:2; 6:23).
- D. We have only ourselves to blame for our sin and its consequences (Jas. 1:14-15). But we often justify/rationalize our sins.
- E. Make no mistake God has joined together "sin and death" and we couldn't put them asunder even if we tried!

6. 16 Belief and Baptism: 17 Mk. 16:16

- A. It's always been amazing to me that the vast majority of "Christendom" puts belief and baptism asunder by teaching that baptism is not essential to salvation.
- B. The Bible clearly teaches no such thing! Gal. 3:26-27; I Peter 3:21; Rom. 6:3; Acts 2:37-38, 41, 47; 9:6; 22:16; 18:8
- C. God has joined together "belief and baptism" and any man putting them asunder nullifies the gospel plan of salvation!

7. 18 Unbelief and Condemnation: 19 Jn. 3:18

- A. Jesus does not mention baptism in reference to the unbeliever in Mk. 16:16; because baptism is nothing more than an empty, vain and useless ritual without belief! It is something an unbeliever would only submit to as some sort of joke or stunt.
- B. Because, you see, at the heart of unbelief, in any form, is a rejection of God! Jn. 3:18; unbelief and disobedience equivocated in Heb. 3:12-19
- C. Unbelievers will suffer eternal punishment, the "second death" (Rev. 21:8) just as will "those who do not obey the gospel of our Lord Jesus Christ" because they are one in the same! 2 Thess. 1:7-9

III. CONCLUSION:

- 1. 20 We need to be extremely careful that we never put asunder that which God has joined together:
 - ✓ Husband and Wife
 - ✓ Christ and the Church
 - ✓ Worship in Spirit and in Truth
 - √ Works and Faith
 - ✓ Sin and Death
 - ✓ Belief and Baptism
 - ✓ Unbelief and Condemnation
- 2. Invitation
