True But Not Applied

While reading the September 6, 2017 Westside Community News, an article: Some Thoughts About The Bible, written by a Christian Church preacher, caught my attention: He said: "If God says that something is right or wrong, then that should settle the issue. We must never forget the specifics of God's message." These statement are the truth, right on; but Christian Church preachers do not make application of this grand ledged truth! Come and take a look:

1) The Church: The Bible never calls the New Testament Church, the Christian Church. The name Christian appears three times in the Bible (Ac. 11:26; Ac. 26:28; I Pet. 4:16). It is the name predicted in the Old Testament (Isa. 56:5; 62:2; 65:15). This name is applied to "disciples" and individuals;

never to the church! Take a look at I "And the disciples were first Peter 4:16. Peter says: "Yet if any man, suffer as a Christian, let him not be ashamed; but let him glorify God on Acts 11:26 this behalf." A "man and him" is not the church! Paul penned: "For the

body is not one member, but many" (I Cor. 12:14). The body is the "Church" (Col. 1:24). In the words of this Christian Church preacher: "If God says something is right or wrong, then that should settle the issue; we must never forget the specifics of God's message!"

2) The Worship: Among the channels of New Testament worship is "singing." Ten times, in the New Testament, the Bible authorizes singing as the kind of music God has specified (Mt. 26:30; Mk.14:26; Ac. 16:25; Ro. 15:9; I Cor. 14:15; Ep. 5:19; Col. 3:16; Heb.2:12; Heb. 13:15; Jas. 5:13). Read 'em; they all teach each one to sing! Many Christian Churches have full-fledged bands in their worship! Most have mechanical instrumental music. Remember the Christian Church preacher writing: "We must never forget the specifics of God's message!" God specified singing in worship!

3) A Play House: Many Christian Churches promote fun and frolic with kitchens, coffee shops, gyms, family life centers and more. Now read Romans 14:17!

Is Sincerity Enough for Salvation?

Apparently, many sincere people are trusting in their sincerity for

salvation. But is sincerity enough? Jesus said, "....I am the way, the truth, and the life. No one comes to the Father except through Me" (John 14:6). Now **John 14:6** what could this possibly mean if sincerity alone is sufficient?

If there is no other way to salvation than through Christ, as He clearly stated here, then sincerity alone will not do, will it?

One of the classical examples of a man who was unquestionably sincere, and yet lost, out of Christ, and even an arch enemy of the early church, is that of Saul of Tarsus. Saul had even participated in the murder of the first Christian martyr, Stephen (Acts 7:58). He "....made havoc of the church, entering every house, and dragging off men and women, committing them to prison" (Acts 8:3). It is even reported further that "Saul, still breathing threats and murder against the disciples of the Lord, went to the high priest and asked letters from him to the synagogues of Damascus, so that if he found any who were of the Way, whether men or women, he might bring them bound to Jerusalem" (Acts 9:1-2). So here is a man who is religious about persecuting the way of Christ, believing lesus to be an imposter. Yet, though misguided, he said, "....I have lived in all good conscience before God until this day" (Acts 23:1). He had been sincere, but that sincerity wasn't enough, because you see,

sin is not just a matter of violating your conscience; it is a matter of violating the will of God. John was speaking of this in I John, Chapter 3, verse 4, when he said, of the Lord" "Whoever commits sin also

commits lawlessness, and sin is lawlessness."

In the course of time a Christian named Ananias informed Saul, "And now why are you waiting? Arise and be baptized, and wash away your sins, calling on the name of the Lord" (Acts 22:16). Yet Saul's story ends happily because when he learned the error of his way, he was sincere

enough to turn from his sins to Christ and he went on to become the great Apostle Paul.

In Acts Chapter 2, we read that there were dwelling at Jerusalem, lews, devout men, out of every nation under heaven (verse 5). Yet, as Peter preached to these sincere people, he accused them with these words: "Him, being delivered by the determined purpose and foreknowledge of God, you have taken by lawless hands, have crucified, and put to death" (Acts 2:23). Although they were devout, they had participated in the crucifixion of the Lord. On learning of their sin, they were (as the Bible says) "....cut to the heart, and said to Peter and the rest of the apostles, 'Men and brethren, what shall we do?" (Acts 2:37). They now realized that they were guilty before the Lord God. And as they were searching for a cleansing from this guilt, Peter said to them, "Repent, and let every one of you be baptized in the name of Jesus Christ for the remission of sins; and you shall receive the gift of the Holy Spirit" (Acts 2:38).

The role of sincerity is to enable a person to be fair and honest with the truth! Sincerity alone does not determine truth, scientifically, and medically, legally, or religiously. We can see then, what lesus was saying when He said, "Not everyone who says to Me, 'Lord, Lord,' shall enter the kingdom of heaven, but he who does the will of My Father in heaven" (Matthew 7:21).
